

Wednesday, April 2, 1958

At a regular meeting of the County Court on the date set above at which time were present County Judge O. E. Effenberger and Commissioners Wesley Schulmerich and A. H. Tilden, the following business was transacted.

The Court signed orders directing that certain lands be deeded to the State Board of Forestry and also executed deeds thereto.

The Court approved the exchange of certain lands between the State of Oregon, Board of Forestry and Robert E. and Evylene Carroll and between State of Oregon, Board of Forestry and W. S. and Pearl F. Coates.

The Court signed a supplemental through-way agreement involving the Southern Pacific Crossing on the Old Wilson River Highway now taken over by the County.

Mr. Swensen of the State Highway Commission met with the Court to discuss matters concerning Cape Meares Drive Road. He also discussed the matter of the weighing station on the Old Wilson River Highway. The Court agreed to maintain the building housing the scale and to pay the monthly electric bill if the State will assume care of the scale itself and arrange for the annual check by the Department of Agriculture. The County will be allowed to use the scale when necessary.

Mr. Howard Hodge, Hospital Administrator, met with the Court to discuss the matter of ambulance service, and the Court agreed to request an opinion from the District Attorney as to whether or not ambulance service could be maintained by the hospital.


A committee from the various service organizations met with the Court to discuss the ball park at the fair grounds.


Mr. Schermer from Pacific City met with the Court to discuss the matter of placing speed signs, etc. in the Pacific City area.


At ten o'clock hearing was had in the matter of the vacation of a road in Juno Heights. Objections were filed by Allen E. Fisher and W. A. Church, and Mr. George Goodrich and Mr. W. A. Church appeared in person to protest the vacation. It was the decision of the Court that the Petition be denied. Mrs. Lchtenthaler and her Attorney H. T. Botts were present at the hearing to answer questions of property owners in the area.

Mr. Bill Phelps and Mr. Birch (?) of the Board of Forestry met with the Court.

Members of the Fair Board and 4-H Leaders called on the Court to ask that a one mill levy be placed on the ballott for the purpose of raising money for expansion of 4-H buildings at the Fair Grounds. A motion as follows was made by Niel Morse and Seconded by Carl Zweifel and carried: "I move that this group go on record as indicating to the County Court that they are in favor of placing a 4-H building project on the ballott for the approval of the voters- one mill for two years. The Court agreed to present the matter to the voters of the County.
