Natural Hazards Mitigation Goals and Objectives

The following multi-jurisdictional natural hazards mitigation goals and objectives were agreed upon at the Tuesday, March 7, 2017 mitigation strategy meeting.

Natural Hazards Mitigation Goals and Objectives

- Goal I. Develop and implement effective mitigation initiatives, projects, and activities to reduce hazards to life, businesses, property, and environmental systems.
 - Objective A. Maintain effective natural hazards mitigation plans and regulations.
 - Objective B. Promote purchase of insurance coverage to mitigate economic loss and enhance post-disaster resilience.
 - Objective C. Preserve environmental systems to serve natural hazard mitigation functions.
 - Objective D. Advance natural hazards mitigation with updated data and information as it becomes available.
 - Objective E. Educate the public about natural hazards and mitigation.
 - Objective F. Seek funding and partnerships as needed to implement mitigation initiatives, projects, and activities.

- Goal II. Enhance emergency services and the capabilities of local first responders.
 - Objective A. Enhance the ability of individuals and businesses to be self-reliant for an extended period of time.
 - Objective B. Seek funding to provide first responders with the training and tools they need to respond effectively to all hazard events.
 - Objective C. Strengthen emergency operations by improving communication and coordination.

- Goal III. Improve regional coordination and communication.
 - Objective A. Participate in the countywide Hazard Mitigation Steering Committee.
 - Objective B. Maintain active and collaborative emergency preparedness committees covering the county.
 - Objective C. Improve communication and collaboration between Emergency Operations Centers, including the Tillamook Citizens Corps Council, Emergency Volunteer Corps of Nehalem Bay, Community Emergency Response Teams, Incident Command Teams, Fire Districts, Emergency Services Departments, Public Works Departments, Law Enforcement Agencies, and others. In particular, collaborate on updating the County Emergency Response Plan.
 - Objective D. As funding becomes available, individual jurisdictions will continue to survey their populations about personal preparedness and develop coordinated response plans for each potential hazard.
