ORDER

#09 - 005

This matter came on to be heard this ~~14th~~ day of January, 2009 at a regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners. Liane Welch, Director of Public Works, has requested that a portion of Trask River Road be posted No Parking except temporarily for those who are in the act of launching boats at the south side of Trask River Road from the Cedar Creek crossing upstream (east) for a distance of 150 feet beginning at approximately milepost 5.2 as detailed in Exhibit "A".

Being fully apprized of the records and files therein, the Board of Commissioners finds as follows:

1. The Tillamook County Board of Commissioners acts as the local road authority in accordance with ORS 810.010 and ORS 810.160.
2. Tillamook County Public Works received a letter from the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife. The letter requested designating an area as a No Parking Zone except temporarily while in the act of launching boats over the bank.
3. For the reasons of public safety and welfare, it is in the interest of the public to establish a "No Parking" zone except to launch boats for that portion of Trask River Road as detailed in Exhibit "A".

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

4. The above described locations be and are hereby declared as a "No Parking" zone except to launch boats as defined in ORS 801.380.
5. The Tillamook County Public Works Department shall install the appropriate signs for regulating this zone.




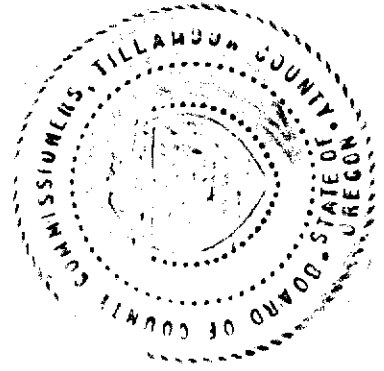

Dear Liane:

The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW), in cooperation with Tillamook County through its Public Works Department, is currently working on a project to improve boat launching and public safety at ODFW's property adjacent to Trask River Road beginning at approximately milepost 5.2.

The first phase of the project was recently completed. This portion of the project involved widening the road shoulder to allow vehicles to pull off the roadway while launching boats over the bank. ODFW, after securing appropriate permits, will construct a boat slide to facilitate launching while minimizing bank erosion at the site. In the meantime, a problem has arisen at the site that we feel needs to be addressed by Tillamook County. The issue is that vehicles not involved in boat launching are parking on the newly improved road shoulder. This has the potential to interfere with or completely block people who wish to launch boats at the site.

The purpose of this project was to allow for safer boat launching, not to create additional parking along the road. Therefore, ODFW requests that Tillamook County designate this area as a no parking zone (except temporarily while in the act of launching boats). Specifically, we ask that the south side of Trask River Road from the Cedar Creek crossing upstream (east) for a distance of 150 feet be designated for no parking.
