Mr. Clare Foreward talked to the Court about his airplane which was demolished in the hangar at the county airport during the Columbus Day Storm. Mr. Foreward was advised that inasmuch as the Court had not granted permission for him to use the hangar they had no liability in the matter.

A group from the Pacific City Chamber of Commerce visited the Court to discuss obtaining advertising money for the coming year. They were advised to present statements showing how the money had been spent.

At a regular meeting of the County Court on the date set above at which time were present County Judge H. Clay Myers and Commissioners A. H. Tilden and L. C. Schulmerich, the following business was transacted.

Marvin Hopkes, Pete Sorensen, Reuben Schrock and James Larrew met with the Court to discuss the closure of the East Beaver, Moon Creek, Clarence Creek and Blaine Roads due to the cold weather. They were advised that the roads would be open for hauling Thursday, February 7, but that Mr. Schrock would be prohibited from hauling till Monday inasmuch as he had disobeyed the closing order. The Court advised the group that failure to observe closure orders in the future would result in the hauler being prohibited from using the roads for ten days.

Order was signed modifying order prohibiting over-night camping in Woods Park.

Tom Edwards discussed with the Court the matter of locating a new garbage deump in the Cloverdale-Pacific City area. Mr. Schulmerich was to look over a prospective site with Mr. Edwards.
