Mr. George Winslow met with the Court to discuss the Meadow Lake matter.

Mr. Shick and Mr. Stephenson of the State Parks Department met with the Court to discuss the proposed acquisition of property (private) in the Necarney City subdivision on Nehalem Spit, as well as Cape Meares State Park. The Court indicated that property owners in the area are opposed to the State taking these private lots off the tax rolls and requested that as many blocks as possible be eliminated from the park area.

Due to the fact that the restrooms at the Netarts Boat Landing have been vandalized each time they have been serviced by the county during the past six weeks and the facilities broken, mud spattered on walls and toilets filled with sand and rocks, the Court has ordered No Trespassing signs posted thereon and the restrooms boarded up. The restroom at Oceanside has also been ordered closed and posted for the same reasons.
