Chairman Brennan, together with Carroll Adams and Jack Madison went to Salem to meet with the Governor in regard to the disaster matter. The County suffered more heavy damage due to flood damage.

Attorney Donald J. DeFrancq, representing Dr. Deweese and Mr. Johnson on the street encroachment matter at Kiawanda Beach met with the commissioners to present his clients' suggestion for resolving the matter. Mr. DeFrancq indicated that the westerly one half of Alameda Street, if vacated, would not come after the county park designation, even though it would accrue to park land.




Order was signed in the matter of designating polling places and election boards for the Park and Recreation District election.
