






Order was signed in the matter of cancelling credits carried on the Tax Rolls.

Residents of the Pleasant Valley Area met with the Commissioners and H. S. Cox, K. D. Wolfe, Gerald Wimer, George Wills, and Rod Henry of the State Highway Division to discuss the proposed re-alignment of Highway 101 between Pleasant Valley and Green Timber Road. Maps of the proposed re-alignment were shown property owners and questions regarding the relocation of homes, etc. were answered by the Highway Division representatives. A formal hearing on the matter will be held at a later date. Most of the property owners present did not object to the relocation.

Mr. Hines from the Governor's Office met with the Commissioners and explained that funds on a 1/3 county and 2/3 federal basis to make geological studies for planning purposes, etc. Funds are distributed thru Housing and Urban Development. The Commissioners asked Mr. Hines to attempt to earmark \$50,000 to \$70,000 for Tillamook County. Planning Director Smith suggested that the Cape Meares Area from the slide on the Bayocean Road to Short Creek would be a good place to start. Commissioners agreed.
