

Wednesday, November 3, 1971

At a regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners on the date set above at which time were present Chairman R. F. Brennan and Commissioners F. E. Knight and Chas D. Bailey, the following business was transacted.

Bids for anti-freeze were opened. Pacific City Supply submitted the low bid of \$1.23 per gallon. Other bids were: Union Oil \$1.285; McKenzie Motor \$1.39; Phillips 66 \$1.60; Texaco \$1.265.

Hearing on the proposed nuisance ordinance for Tillamook County which had been continued from September 1st was held. The proposed ordinance was read, after which comments were entertained from those attending. Inasmuch as it appeared that the ordinance in its present form would not be to the best interests of the residents of the county, the matter was continued until such time as it can be revised and another hearing called. The Creamery Association submitted a statement pointing out sections which might subject farmers to harassment and possible legal proceedings because of spreading barnyard manure and refuse vegetables used for cattle food. Several persons from the Twin Rocks area objected that the ordinance did not cover noise pollution.

Mr. Gene Leuthold discussed a proposed plat of Foley Creek, being subdivided by Foley Creek Development, Inc.




