The Budget Committee will discuss compensation of elective officers per ORS 204.126, deliberate and approve any change in the compensation of an elective county officer. Any person may appear at the meeting and discuss the proposed programs with the Budget Committee.

The commissioners will hold their annual Workshop on **Wednesday, March 25, 2015** at **3:00 p.m.** with the Citizen Advisory Committee (CAC) chairs and staff from the Community Development Department to review the CACs' 2014 accomplishments and to discuss matters of mutual concern. The workshop will be held in the commissioners' meeting Room B in the Tillamook County Courthouse, 201 Laurel Avenue, Tillamook.

As a result of General Fund budget cuts some county offices will be closed a total of four days during the next four months: March 13, April 10, May 8, and June 12, 2015. This means that all the county offices in the Courthouse will be **closed except** for Veterans Services and the State Courts. In addition the Community Development Department and Surveyor's office will be **closed**. Those offices are located in the TLC Federal Credit Union building. The Tillamook Library, Parks Department, administrative offices in the jail and justice facility, and the Health Department and clinics will remain **open**. The Road Department, during construction season, works ten-hour days Monday through Thursday.

### **2014 ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

#### **STREAM RESTORATION**

The Council's prime 2014 restoration project was replacing two culverts on George Creek (Evergreen Road) with a new 36 foot long bridge. The \$244,000 project was completed on time and slightly over budget. Construction was overseen by River Design Group and Tillamook Co. Public Works. This project opened up one mile of high quality aquatic habitat. Partners included Oregon Watershed Enhancement Board, Tillamook County, ODFW, US Fish & Wildlife Service, US Forest Service and the Whole Watershed Restoration Initiative.

Design took place this year for the Council to replace two culverts on Moon Creek and another two on Boulder and Horn Creeks (Blankenship Road & Old Woods Road, respectively). Funding for Moon Creek work was partially awarded in 2014.

Assessments to determine if culverts need to be replaced continue at other crossings including Reneke Creek at Sand Lake, Three Rivers, Little Nestucca and Nestucca rivers in 2014.

#### **STREAMSIDE PLANTING**

In 2014 the Council worked with 9 landowners to plant 11 acres along 1.4 stream miles and maintained recent plantings of 40 acres along 10 stream miles. Focus streams for planting were Three Rivers and Nestucca River. Benefits include future shading and nutrient use by those trees.

#### **TREE & SHRUB NURSERIES**

Students propagated over 1,300 native plants in 2014. Council native plant nurseries at two local schools allowed class instruction followed by plant cutting and potting. More plants were added to the larger Nestucca Valley Elementary School nursery from our larger cooperative facility in Tillamook. NNWC and the schools use the nurseries for both education and project planting.

#### **CLEAN UP/ NOXIOUS WEED REDUCTION**

In June of 2014 12 volunteers removed several hundred pounds of scots broom from a couple of acres on Whalen Island at Sand Lake. This was done in conjunction with Oregon State Parks staff. A big Thank You to our volunteers!

#### **EDUCATION/OUTREACH**

The Council Coordinator participated in the Children's Clean Water Festival, Down By The riverside event and plant classes in December, all of which included local elementary students. Over 90 students and 9 adults participated. The Council staffed a booth again at Dory Days Marine Fair. Council meetings with public speakers included Fish Surveying & Restoration, BLM Restoration in the Upper Nestucca basin, and a Science Pub on Beavers.

Dear Ms. Hoefler:

The Board of Commissioners has received your March 9<sup>th</sup> letter regarding the "Bi-Mart" deal. To say the least we were quite taken back by your letter.

In your letter you state: *"My friends and neighbors are wondering if Fred Meyer influenced you, the Tillamook Commission, to squelch the Bi-Mart Deal?"* This couldn't be further from the truth. In fact our Commission was quite aggressive in courting Bi-Mart and several other commercial prospects in May of 2011 regarding a location just east of Tillamook adjacent to Highway 6.

We worked directly with the developer and their representative as did the City of Tillamook, Tillamook Economic Development Council, the Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) and others on what we all called the Town Center Project. We held several meetings with the developer between April of 2011 and May 2012. As you may remember, this was during the height of the recession. We'll share with you a portion of the email from the developer (May 2012) that was quite disheartening to all of us who worked to bring this business and others to Tillamook.

Here is the email that was sent to our Commission. *"I am sorry to report that the Town Center project is on long term HOLD. The Megdal Company has canceled their contract to purchase the land due to the fact that Goodwill has gone forward with another location and Bi-Mart has developed cold feet due to lagging market sale conditions. Obviously without those two major players, the project doesn't merit further effort. Thank you so much for your continued interest and support for the project and it has been refreshing to have the powers that be so supportive of a development project these days. I can assure you this is not the norm."*



Tillamook County is developing a Partners for Rural Innovation Center. It is an exciting collaboration between Tillamook Bay Community College (TBCC) and OSU Extension Service/OSU Open Campus. The Partners for Rural Innovation Center will bring together the TBCC Agriculture and Natural Resources degree program, OSU Extension Service/OSU Open Campus, TBCC Small Business Development Center, Tillamook Economic Development Center, and the Regional Solutions team under one roof to align and anchor resources for a shared commitment and investment in Tillamook County's economic future.

Our community will benefit by increased shared access to educational opportunities, enhancing the career/college-going culture in the community, and providing access to workforce training for the 21<sup>st</sup> century employee. The Tillamook County Board of Commissioners is 100% behind this venture.

The Tillamook Bay Community College Foundation has submitted a letter of inquiry to the Spirit Mountain Community Fund seeking support for the project. We are hopeful the tribe will agree, as we do, that the project can transform the educational environment for a largely low-income and educationally-underprepared population. Completion of this dedicated partner-driven building will open the doors to many in our community who did not believe there was a path for them to career or college. When

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
students studying in the 4-H program and Open Campus youth activities see this clear path to career and college; it will change their perception around post-secondary education and encourage more first generation college attendees.

The Tillamook County Commissioners feel so strongly about the value of the project to our community and its ability to serve residents that we want to submit a letter of community support.




